From the Pastor

For All You Gardeners Creatures great and small, God loves them all!

"Many gardeners now actively garden with wildlife in mind. The problem is that the wildlife you will see in your garden is only the tip of the iceberg; the bees, birds, and butterflies are only about five per cent of even the larger inhabitants of an average garden. Most of the earthworms, slugs, snails, woodlice, centipedes, millipedes, harvestmen, spiders, bugs, flies, sawflies, wasps, beetles, moths and ants are inevitably going to escape attention.

"Few people realize that at least half of all animal biomass on the planet is found below ground. By far the most abundant animals on Earth are nematodes (or roundworms). Nematodes are tiny, just about visible to the naked eye, but there are about 55 billion (with a "b") nematodes for every human in the world's soils, and four out of every five individual land animals are nematodes.

"Ants are another group of animals that are more abundant than you realize. There are billions and billions and billions of individual ants worldwide, with a combined total weight greater than all wild birds and mammals combined. [Probably 275 billion ants for every human worldwide.] If you ever see a green woodpecker in your garden, ants are probably the reason. Some plants rely on ants for see dispersal.

"Okay, so you are thinking, 'Spiders are not invisible – my garden is full of spiders.' And so it is, but you probably fail to notice most of them. Not all spiders spin webs, even though all spiders made silk.

"Globally, there are at least 45,000 species of spider, and all of them are predators of insects. To put that into perspective, the world's spiders consume annually a weight of insects about the same as the weight of meat and fish consumed by the human population. Spiders are important food for many garden birds. Some birds even use spider webs to build their nests."

I, Pastor Beake, like elephants, whales, penguins, rhinoceroses, zebras, and giraffes but you have to appreciate God's engineering and plans for the whole world and it's 'circle of life' even among the smallest living things. And we did not even talk about bacteria, micro-organisms, and the like.


